Wings Enterprises Inc, a Missouri Corporation, is requesting a determination letter regarding the permitting path for the scope of our proposed project. This project is initially limited to reopening the Pea Ridge from Ore Mine and constructing a pipeline under the preview of the Army Corns Engineers.

Wings Enterprises owns the Pea Ridge Iron Ore Reserve in Washington County Missouri. Wings intends to reopen the mine and produce into ore oxide (the Pea Ridge Mine has a 38 year operational history without any environmental issues of significance). Wings intends to ship the iron ore in a slavery pictine 44 willes to a location study Mississipp River. From that location Wings intends to sell from ore concentrate. The production and sale of from ore oxide is a stand-alone beausiess.

However, we are including mention of a potential pig iron production facility in the final design, as this would be incorporated in our final design of the project if it proves possible. However, the pig iron portion of the project may be entirely academic, as this technology is not yet proven on a commercial scale. If technology and/or permitting are not readily accessible Wings will forgo the pig from production option.

Logistics at the river will be handled by American Milling / American Boat, a well established barge and rail trans-shipment Company. Wings will be less than 20% of American Millings total business.

Wiggs currently holds a Mining Minerals Waste Permit (MMWA 8007) and an NFDS permit. Recoperain the mine will also require an air permit. This air permit will be limited to the milling and bearchetion of iron ore oxide concentrate. Wings anticipates that all air quality source related to the curvaling of ore with the widths the legal timins of a say. Wings will also need to apply for other permits such as Land Distrations can Select within the neview of the Arm's Corne Engineers.

Wings would like to establish a determination on the permitting path, as these issues will prove critical to financing and development of the overall project. As this project is important to Wings Enterprises and the State of Missouri, a determination of the path forward is critical. Projects of this scope, potentially \$1.5 billion, require some level of confidence. I would appreciate a letter of determination regarding this project so that we
