- Training at the Reduction site with Crystal City Fire Department and surrounding Mutual Aid Companies.
- Each building should be numbered or letter on the outside so it can easily be identified in case of an emergency.
- Notification of any hazardous material on site.
- Routine fire drills
- Purchase or supply any tools or misc. equipment needed for the fire department due to the new equipment at the site.

## EMERGENCY PLAN - IRON ORE REDUCTION PLANT

## PROCEDURE FOR 1" ALARM AT SITE:

- 1. Crystal City Fire and Festus Fire Departments are dispatched to the 1st alarm at the site.
- 2. Arrive at the scene, investigate fire, and set up command post.
- 3. Determine if other agencies are needed and dispatch if necessary.
- 4. Standard procedures are then taken to put alarm under control.

Water will come from various sources that will include plant in house sprinkler system, fire hydrants within the vicinity of the plant and if needed, we will draft water from Plattin Creek that runs along the property. If a fire is near the barge or rail facility, we can use tankers from other mutual aid companies and also use water from the Mississippi River.
